# Pupil Premium Grant - Report to Parents



# What is Pupil Premium and who is it for?

Pupil premium is additional funding provided to schools for supporting more disadvantaged pupils. It is hoped that pupil premium will address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding reaches the pupils who need it most and is used to tackle any disadvantage.

There are three categories of children that qualify for pupil premium:

- Children who are or have in the past 6 years been eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Looked after children (LAC)
- Armed forces children

#### **Key Principles**

Our key objective in using the Pupil Premium grant is to narrow the gap between pupil groups. As a school we have a good track record of ensuring that make pupils make at least good progress, but historically levels of attainment have been lower for FSM pupils- this is also a national trend. Through targeted interventions we are working to eliminate barriers to learning and progress.

The work of the Education Endowment Fund and the Sutton Trust are key in helping us inform our decision making. We analyse our data thoroughly and as a small school have the advantage of knowing each pupil well. Although there are some common barriers for FSM pupils, the barriers to achievement may be complex. Therefore, we are flexible in considering the best manner in which to support pupils and there is no 'one size fits all' approach.

We ensure that all staff are aware of whom pupil premium children are. All pupil premium children benefit from the funding, not just those who are underperforming.

We will continue to ensure that all children across the school consistently receive good or outstanding teaching. Research by the Sutton Trust (2011) showed that highly effective teaching has significantly greater impact on disadvantaged students as opposed to average students.

All children will continue to benefit from regular feedback from their class teacher so that they know where they are and what they need to improve. Effective feedback has been determined by the Sutton Trust as being the most cost effective intervention in raising pupil attainment.

We have a Pupil Premium Governor who monitors the spending and impact of this funding.

Children's individual needs will be considered carefully so that we try and provide support for those pupils who could be doing 'even better if...'

# Overview of nature of support and curriculum focus offered to eligible pupils 2014/15

#### **Enriching the Curriculum**

At St Gildas' we aim to provide children with learning experiences and opportunities that they may not always have access to. This year we have had theatre groups perform, architectural workshops, subsidised visits to places of interest, sports coaching, dance lessons, specialist music teacher, street dance teacher, healthy eating presentations.

#### **Targeted Support**

Support strategies for those who need additional help in reading, writing and maths have also been funded through the pupil premium such as: reading/spelling programmes, social skills/friendship groups, nurture groups, computer software programmes targeted at specific pupils, 1-1 tuition.

Some pupils work with a teaching assistant in the classroom and some have worked beyond the classroom with our higher level teaching assistant (Maths specialist) who has run targeted maths groups.

The school employs a learning mentor two days a week who works with children and their families. The learning mentor runs homework clubs, transition groups, nurture groups, lunchtime clubs, therapeutic writing sessions and offers additional support to parents and families.

Teaching assistants have run a variety of interventions which target specific needs of a range of pupils under the supervision of our special needs coordinator.

#### **Extended School Support**

Our families have access to a range of activities beyond the school day that further support child development. The pupil premium grant has contributed towards the costs of these activities some of which were previously funded by other grants: breakfast club, residential visit to Pendarren (Wales), dance club, choir, chess club, science club, homework club, gardening club, newsletter club.
